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### ① **Guesthouse Eduard II, 11 Ed. Decuyperstraat**

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A cosy B&B with two rooms in an Art Deco house dating from 1933, built by architect Andre Daniels, who also worked on the imposing Thermae Palace Hotel. The artistic hostess has many talents, speaks fluent Russian and has an exceptional eye for beautiful objects. The rooms facing the Hippodrome are simply furnished and equipped with every comfort. The plentiful breakfast is excellent and is served in a room dominated by a painting of the hostess on fibreglass.

### ② **Spoor 62, 29 Moerdijkstraat, Moere**

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Moere is a village in the polders, 20 minutes from Ostend. On the spot where a scenic cycle route now lies was once a railway line which carried the beau monde back and forth between Ostend and Paris on Line 62. Today, the former railway station of this famous line forms the setting for a lovely B&B, where peace and quiet, discreet luxury and heritage embrace each other. There are two guest rooms in which design icons (such as Eames chairs and the Tulip table by Saarinen) are combined with neutral colours and natural materials such as wooden floors.
